<u>365 DAYS OF POSSIBILITIES</u>— I would imagine that like most people (even Christians), when you experience something unfortunate or difficult in life, you're not always calm. Instead, you might cry, brood over the problem, be disappointed, or maybe even go into a mini emotional tailspin. You might call a friend, dump your feelings on a spouse or significant other, or even lament on Social media about what to do.

I was recently reminded that when trouble comes knocking, a better solution is to go to Jesus first before I work myself into an emotional mess.

If you can relate, the story in (Mark 9) about a man who brought his possessed son to Jesus will encourage you. In this story, a spirit had robbed the young boy of his speech. The man told Jesus he had already taken his son to the disciples, but they couldn't drive out the spirit. In response, Jesus said, "bring the boy to Me." This simple instruction reminded me –

When life throws you and me a curveball, Jesus is saying, "Bring the (fill in the blank) to Me."

Yield to the Spirit's gentle touch; be sensitive to His prompting. Exert your will to trust Me in all circumstances. Don't let your need to understand distract you from My Presence.
